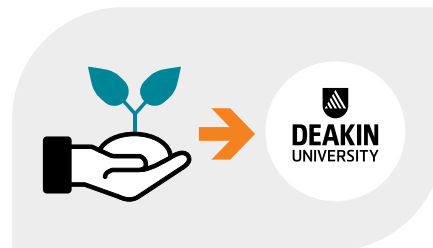

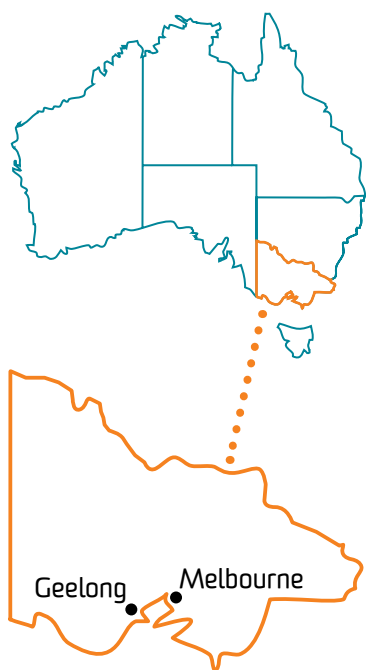


# Your pathway to Deakin University

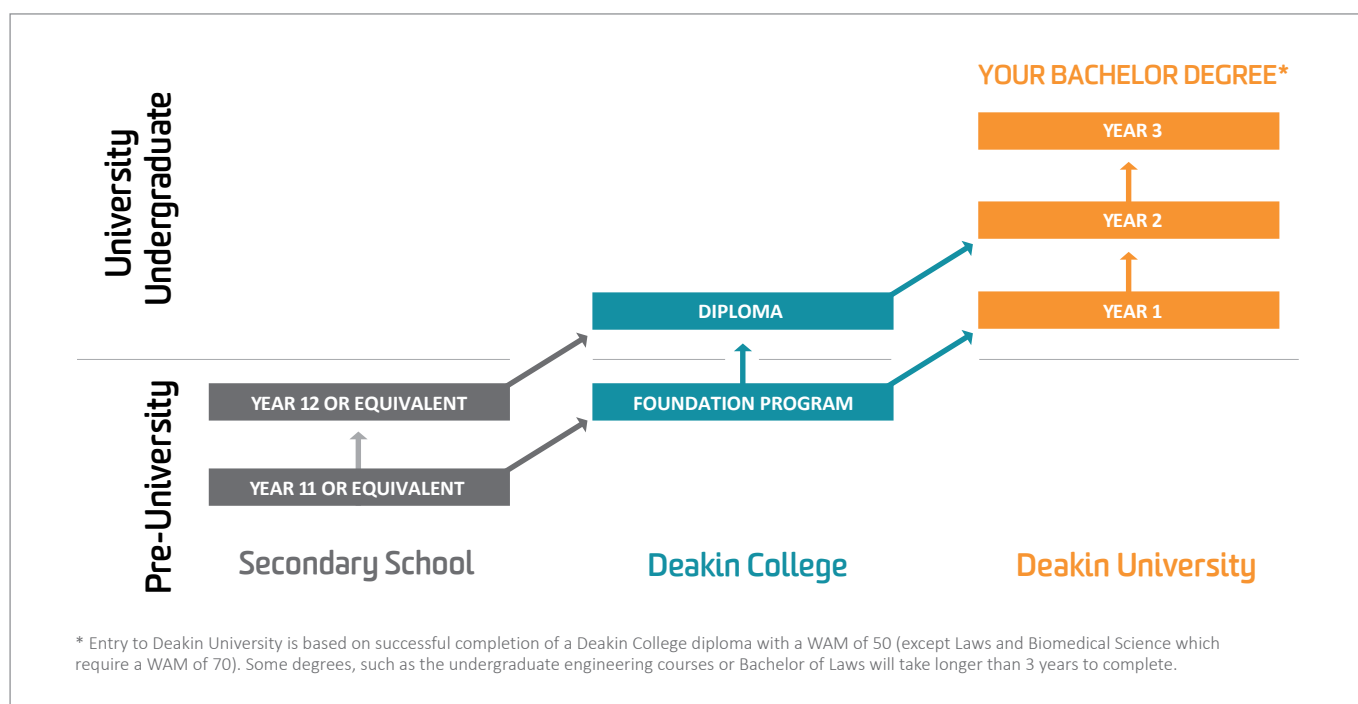
## Fast-track options
